Paving & Road Work

Hole at Farnham Point Rd & Rte 96

That time has passed and the hole has expanded over the winter. Our efforts continue to get the DOT to address this and Jeff DeMauro of East Boothbay Landscaping has been in touch with them as well. Meanwhile, please use caution when driving northbound on 96 -- especially while making a right turn onto Farnham Point Rd.
